## Rohingya Refugees in Bangladesh and Maternal, Newborn, and Child Health

In August of 2017, nearly 1 million individuals were displaced from the Rakine State of Myanmar, after targeted state-led violence forced them to retreat into the Southeast region of Bangladesh.



- 850,000 Rohingya refugees, of which over 56% are women and children, currently reside in 34 highly congested camps without outside access.
- These camps are run by the Government of Bangladesh and supported by UN Agencies and NGOs.
- The host communities surrounding these camps are some of the poorest in Bangladesh and lack access to education and healthcare services the additional nearly 1 million people has placed significant strain on already scant resources and underdeveloped systems.

- Committee participation in multiple Health Sector groups working to improve infection, prevention, and control, hospital transfers associated with pregnancy, sexual and reproductive health working group, and others.
- ▶ Strategic advising provided for Maternal and Perinatal Death Surveillance programs.

Great efforts have been made to improve outcomes; however, much work remains – with just over half of women delivering in a facility and significant challenges with transfers and specialty care, the Integral team has worked to enhance quality and coordination.
